	How are new musical genres formed?	Fusions: Esperanza Spalding: Samba Em Preludio (from the album 'Esperanza') - In this unit, students will explore their fourth "Set Work". Students will analyse fusions, in particular jazz and Latin American styles, applying their musical knowledge and skills; working as an ensemble to explore a range of performance techniques.
	How is technology integral to the development of rock music?	Vocal Music: Queen: Killer Queen (from the album 'Sheer Heart Attack') - In this unit, students will explore British rock bands and musicals. Students will work together learning various songs as a class band. Students will appraise the set work; identifying the various elements of music within the piece.
	How does the use of tonality provoke emotions within pieces of music?	L van Beethoven: 1st Movement from Piano Sonata no. 8 in C minor 'Pathétique' - In this unit, students will explore their sixth "Set Work". This will develop musicality through skill based tasks related to the Classical period of music history; identifying the context, key, vocabulary, stylistic devices and terminology through a range of compositional and performance tasks.
