We would like to take this opportunity to thank all of our students for their hard work this half term. The GCSEs and GCE examinations have started and Year 11 and 13 are working very hard to make expected and better than expected progress. ## **Some reminders for the summer term 2017**

### **End of Year Assessments**

Year 7 will begin their end of year tests from the week beginning Monday 12<sup>th</sup> June and the end of year reports will be available to go home from the week beginning Monday 26<sup>th</sup> June.

Year 8 will begin their end of year tests from the week beginning Monday 20<sup>th</sup> June and the end of year reports to be available to go home from the week beginning Monday 3<sup>rd</sup> July.

Year 9 will begin their end of year tests from the week beginning Monday 26<sup>th</sup> June and the end of year reports will be available to go home from the week beginning Monday 10<sup>th</sup> July.

Year 10 will be undertaking their mock exams from Thursday 15<sup>th</sup> of June until Monday 3<sup>rd</sup> of July and the end of year reports will be available to go home from the week beginning Monday 10<sup>th</sup> July. ### **Sports Day**

Sports Day is in Allianz Park on Thursday 29<sup>th</sup> June and more information will follow early in the June.

### **Activities Days**

Will be held on Monday 17<sup>th</sup> July and Tuesday 18<sup>th</sup> July both on and off school site. More details will follow towards the end of June.

### **Last day of the summer term**

School finishes for the academic year on Wednesday 19<sup>th</sup> July and students will be dismissed from the site from midday.

### **Uniform - Socks**

The uniform standards for Queen Elizabeth's Girl's school are published in the school planner on page 15 of school diary/planner. While the list is not exhaustive it looks to remove any elements of fashion or trends. Given the warmer weather we currently allow for white ankle socks to be worn instead of the standard black tights. This will be the provision until the start of October. Annually, the option of white ankle socks will be from the start of May until the start of October. The ankle socks should not be frilly, coloured or have a bow. Any other colour sock is not permitted.

### **Uniform - Piercings**

We do not allow piercings to be worn on the tongue, inner lip, cheek, eye brow, wrist, nose or upper ear. Again, page 15 states that only a small plain stud is allowed. This message has been communicated to students in assemblies in every half term by the Head of Year, Mr Haines and Mr Duffy. It is reinforced on a daily basis and such items are confiscated for collection at the end of the half term. Each instance of incorrect uniform is recorded and when there are five instances we deem the infringement to be persistent and a student will have a day in internal exclusion.

### **Phones and Headphones**

Students should have their phones switched off and out of sight before they get onto the school site in the morning and until they leave the school site in the afternoon. The school site starts at the first blue gate from Meadway. Students who have their phone out, for any reason, will have it confiscated. On the first occasion this will be returned at the end of the school day and the second occasion will result in either collection by parents or it can be returned at the end of the following school day.

### **Social Media**

While there are benefits to the use of social media there are also significant drawbacks for young people. We would encourage parents to be aware of their daughters' social media use and we strongly discourage inappropriate use that would include name calling, threats, intimidation or the posting of any material that includes either the school's name or uniform in a derogatory manner (this includes on Snapchat, Instagram, Facebook and other media sites). It is advisable that parents check the age requirements of some websites. The school has consistently taken appropriate measures including internal and fixed term exclusion for any behaviour deemed to be inappropriate towards other students or that brings the school into disrepute. Students are reminded that they should not post any video or images taken from within the school site in line with our safeguarding, data protection and acceptable use policies.

### **Miscellaneous**

Trainers are not to be worn. Should there be an issue with school shoes then students need to report to the appropriate Head of Year at morning registration. Students are allowed to have natural hair colours other than their own. Students are allowed to wear an Alice band but not bandanas or head scarves, unless for religious reasons.

### **Equipment and Books**

Students must ensure they have the correct equipment with them on a daily basis. Students should also carry a reading book with them on daily basis whether that is one from home or from the school library. We have a rolling programme for literacy that utilises their reading book. Students should also ensure they access their locker before morning registration, break time, lunch time and after school.
