Dear Parents and Carers

Summer is here! As I write this letter though, late on Tuesday night, I can see lightening and hear some thunder. However, I am ever hopeful that the warm sunshine will return to grace the weeks ahead. I expect the students and the staff too, will be reflecting on the School year about to pass by and the possibilities that the Summer break may bring. I wish us all as much activity as we can appreciate and as much rest and relaxation as we need to unwind and recoil in time for September and the new School year.

By the time we return to School, our Roofing Project will be under way. Preparatory works are due to start on Thursday 20th July coinciding with the first Site Meeting. We are expecting some works to continue into the Autumn Term and I will write to you again with news of progress in September.

It seems a fitting end to this academic year, to be busy with roof work as we have been busy inside all the buildings during the course of the year and in the School grounds, outside. The School has begun to invest in the longevity of its fabric with allocated expenditure to maintenance that ensures we fulfil our obligations under Health and Safety, with particular regard to Safeguarding and Wellbeing of our School community, students and staff alike. This year we have continued to protect our perimeter, being mindful of security and walking through a *Shelter in Place* protocol. These necessary new concerns for schools to address, make it strange to know that while young people have increasing freedoms, at the same time, they have increasing boundaries. Our students, quite rightly, have strong views on such matters which are very well represented at the weekly meeting of the School Council, to which I am privileged to be invited. The School is planning a number of new platforms for oracy and debate and I hope to bring you more information on those in the Autumn Term.

Of course, our School year could not go by without mentioning the myriad of sporting activities, opportunities and competitions in which the girls have given a strong account of themselves, earning awards, medals and trophies along the way. We saw the launch of *QE Girl*, our magazine for students, by students, with a little help from Ms Hanley, our Chair of the Board of Trustees. This term ended with the Private View of Examination work in Art and Design and Technology; a showcase for the talent, flair and entrepreneurial skills of our students and their teachers. This was followed by Author visits and our Summer Music Concert where students reached new highs and thoroughly entertained all families and friends in the audience. I was especially delighted to meet our new Year 7 families again last week, in a social setting provided by QEGSA, our School Association that develops community, raises funds and models for our students, the important value of service to others. During the course of the year I wrote to you about the successes of our STEM students and our Design and Technology students, finalists and winners in a variety of national competitions. Even this last week has been packed with opportunity for new experiences from a careers carousel event to teambuilding via an assault course in the school grounds and a visit to Boulogne.

These examples of the wealth of activity that goes on in our school, supported by our dedicated staff, ensures the curiosity of our students which is key to their personal development and their academic progress.



By signing the Planner on a weekly basis, you support a dialogue with School that can raise early awareness of any matters you wish to bring to our attention and vice versa. Together with my letter, this week you will have received Mr Duffy's letter with information for next year and Sixth Form families will have received Ms Southwell's additional letter. All of these are available on the School Website together with the School's News and Events Items, Twitter Feeds, the School Calendar and much more besides.
