
School Attendance

- Headteacher for all other reasons



- They are interested in extra-curricular opportunities








How can you support your child's learning?

- Take pride in being a member of the school community








How can you support your child's learning?

- Identify areas for improvement











- 4. Unacceptable variable/lacking focus and commitment, easily distracted, poor participation and contribution.


Home Learning




