Dear Parents and Carers

Re: Uniform Expectations and Standards

I would like to take this opportunity to welcome you to the start of a new academic year and remind you about uniform expectations for all pupils.

In the past few weeks, we have been carrying out uniform checks to ensure all pupils are adhering to the Uniform Expectations and Standards of the school. In the course of these uniform checks, we have found a number of students whose skirt length is still not in line with our standards (skirts must be worn to the knee no more than 5 cm above), wearing unacceptable footwear (trainers, boots, Vans, Converse and casual shoes are not permitted) and jewellery (only a small plain silver or gold stud (matching) worn at the bottom of the lower ear lobe is allowed). Students are allowed a small religious symbol worn inside the blouse (and covered).

If your child wears a skirt to school, we would like your support in ensuring that it is of the appropriate length, and where necessary, that a replacement is purchased. From Monday 2nd October, students may receive a 40-minute after school detention if their skirt is too short, if they do not wear the appropriate footwear or if they wear multiple earrings.
