School Uniform Expectations and Standards

All pupils at Queen Elizabeth's Girls' School from Year 7 to Year 11 are expected to wear the correct school uniform at all times. This includes when travelling to and from school. When wearing our uniform students represent Queen Elizabeth's and are role models in the community both inside and out of the school grounds. The uniform standards for Queen Elizabeth's Girls' school are published in the school planner. While the list below is not exhaustive it looks to remove any elements of fashion or trends. The school will respond in kind when these occur.

Jewellery and piercings

Students are permitted only <u>one</u> small <u>plain silver or gold stud (matching)</u> worn in the lower part of each ear lobe. Students are allowed a small religious symbol necklace worn inside the blouse (and covered). We do not allow piercings to be worn on the tongue, gum, inner lip, cheek, eye brow, wrist, nose or upper ear (only the bottom of the lower ear lobe is allowed). Returning from holidays with piercings is not acceptable. The same rules apply. Each individual day where a student does not comply will be recorded as a uniform infringement and all such occurrences will be logged.



Socks, Tights and skirt

We allow white ankle socks to be worn instead of the standard black tights from the 1st of May until the 1st of October. Otherwise opaque plain black tights are the uniform standard all year.

- The white ankle socks should not be frilly, coloured, have a bow or a design of any description including sports logos. Any other colour sock is not permitted.
- Plain black tights means there should be no patterns of any sort.
- Skirts must be worn to the knee or no more than 5 centimetres above. No rolling up the skirt. The rose emblem on the waist band must be visible at all times.

School shoes

- Sensible flat walking shoes in black leather/leather look.
- Trainers, boots, Vans, Converse and casual shoes are not permitted.
- Trainers are not to be worn.
- If a student is wearing trainers they must report to their Head of Year.
- The Head of Year will verify why shoes are not worn and will work with families to agree a suitable way forward.
- Students without the appropriate socks, tights or shoes may be presented with some by the Head of Year and will be required to wear them.

Nail polish, false nails, hair and make up

- No nail polish colour or style is allowed. Students will be instructed to remove it.
- False eye lashes are not permitted.
- Students found to have excessive make up will be instructed to take it off.
- Only natural hair colours are permitted, grey, blue and pink hair are not natural colours. This also applies to any hair accessories.
- Hair should not be shaved below a grade 3.
- Only the prescribed hair bands are permitted to be worn.
- Any other hair accessories are not permitted, including metallic adornments and fabric intertwined with the hair.

Accessories

- Toys and fashion trends, like slime and fidget spinners, are not permitted.
- Aerosols, perfume and sprays of any kind are not permitted. They constitute a prohibited item that will be confiscated.
- This list is not a definitive and exhaustive list and may be added to at any time by the school and communicated with students and families.



Jewellery

Students are allowed only a small plain silver or gold stud (matching) which may be worn in each ear lobe. Students are allowed a small religious symbol to be worn inside the blouse (and covered).

Socks, Tights and skirt

Opaque plain black tights are the uniform standard all year.



White ankle socks are allowed from the 1st May until the 30 Sept.

Skirt must not be more than 5cm above the knee and the whole school logo should be visible at all times.


Plain black tights means there should be no patterns of any sort.



X The white ankle socks should not be frilly, include colour or have a bow. They should be without a logo or emblem and any other colour sock is not permitted. Ankle bracelets of any description cannot be worn.

Skirt rolled up is not permitted.

School shoes



Trainers, boots, Vans, Converse and casual shoes are not permitted. Kickers (or similar) coming up over ankles are not permitted.

Nail polish, false nails, hair and makeup


Hair styles should be simple and should not draw undue attention to a student.



Hair colour/tints should be within the natural range only.

Hair coverings can be worn for religious reasons and must be plain, undecorated navy or black.

Nail colour or nail extensions should not be worn. Makeup and false eyelashes are also not permitted.



No metal clasps for use in braided hair.

Accessories

Toys and fashion trends like slime and fidget spinners are not permitted. This list may X 🛛 be added to.

Each instance of incorrect uniform is recorded and when there are five instances we deem the infringement to be persistent and a student will usually have a day in internal exclusion.

General Pointers

- All items of uniform MUST be clearly labelled with your daughter's name.
- Jewellery will have to be removed for any practical activities and hair must be tied back appropriately.
- Subject specific risk assessments may necessitate amendments to the above expectations.
